## Residential Maintenance update -

Thank you to those of you who have updated their mailbox and painted their mailbox posts! It has been noticed and we are appreciative. There are still many that need attention. Please keep your yard cut to a considerate height. If you see it moving in the wind, it is probably due for a trim. There are a variety of ways to treat weeds and lawns in an ecologically friendly way. If you don't treat your yard for these issues, many are root/vine based and will spread to your neighbor's yard. There are many websites available to show you how to make non-toxic weed killers as well as organic lawn treatment companies that will fit any wallet. Community inspections are still proceeding on at least a monthly basis that so far have resulted in numerous violation letters being sent out.

There have still been many sightings of houses with algae/mildew on houses, particularly on north facing sides. Time is running out this year to get it resolved before winter sets in. Exterior trim in need of painting is another frequently noticed violation. Painting season is also drawing to a close soon.

Please don't be that homeowner who forces us to spend extra association dues on certified violation letters which causes higher HOA dues.

Trash Bin Requirements — Per the Watson Farm Section I Plat Covenants and Restrictions. Section 14, the last sentence of the second paragraph reads "Garbage and trash cans shall be kept in approved containers which are not visible from the street, except on collection day." To the best of our knowledge, this covenant has not been enforced before so this is a repeat of our previous notice that enforcement is beginning soon. Please remember, the board didn't make these covenants, and doesn't want to be selective in which covenants to enforce.

This is the second notice about this and violations of this covenant will start in October 2020. Here is an example of how it could be done, but there are other solutions to this issue like a large shrub or two, or a more permanent structure. merous YouTube videos on the same subject as this is a common issue across the country. If you plan to build some sort of structure to conceal your trash bins, you will need to submit an Architectural Change Request form for approval of your design.
